- Progress on Goals from the Last Week:
 - Visit Front Range CC to look at their lecture rooms and see if the style would work for the ASCSU Senate Chambers.

 - Financial Forum: again, another good time on the Plaza engaging students in the financial process. It was good to hear student concerns and either be able to answer them on the spot or having something to look for and respond to.
 - ASCSU Student Fee Sustainability Task Force: I will be charging this task force by the beginning of November to assess the services and contracts that the ASCSU student fee covers and look to make sure they are used by the most students possible. I hope that this group will be able to produce good results that we can use in assessing the fee for the future.
 - Bike Library: Andrew, Seth and I met with Molly North and Amy Lewin (currently in charge of the Bike Library) to talk about the history of the program and what it could look like in the future. The program received a three year federal grant that completely funded the program. December 31st the money that was given to the program will run out, and at the point the program will have to look to fund it entirely without federal aid.
 - The city has budgeted for the program for FY13 to run the program during 2013-2014 but with the budget there is about a \$40,000 deficit of funding that needs to be accounted for. We will be looking at ways that the university can aid in the funding for the program as well as ASCSU.
 - Right now, the process will be slow, as the majority of the winter will be spent looking at the infrastructure of the program as well as getting the private funding for the program.
 - Fan Experience Task Force: made some good stride in a few positive fan experience cheers that the group will be looking at and evaluating. Also, we will be looking to send out a student voice survey to see what motivates fans to attend games, what some of the best traditions on campus are, and what some traditions are that we have lost that we would like to re-establish.
 - Ram Leadership Team: make sure to RSVP to Kaylyn about the networking event with the Ram Leadership team. It will be a great experience for the team as well as good for the each of the branches to get to know them.
