- Progress on Goals from the Last Week:
 - Open Positions: Deputy Director of Community Development Greek Life
 - Lory Student Center Renovations: Over the winter break LSC Renovations started. Access points to the building have changed a little. Other than that the student center will continue to operate as normal under regular business hours. We are working on a moving plan that will likely affect ASCSU after finals.

 - RamRide:

 - Looking at some infrastructure of the program and hoping to get a good game plan for the semester and trying to get some sort of long term funding for a dispatch system. Also looking at staffing and how we can make that better.
 - Working a few logistical items regarding community service and volunteer check in for the beginning of the semester.
 - Budget Retreat: ASCSU has the opportunity to present some initial reactions to the university budget. If you are interested in hearing other areas on campus budget presentations as well please let me know and I would be happy to share the schedule with you. It is a very important time in the budget process to please let me know how I can help you understand or help you ask the right questions etc.



- Child Care Task Force: in assessing child care needs on campus this task force has been meeting for the last few months. We are ready to present our initial report to VP Amy Parsons. We will be requesting that there be constant work done to help provide affordable childcare to everyone on campus including students and faculty and staff. There are a number of great resources such as the Early Childhood Center that serves as an educational center as well as a place for top-tier child care.

Finance – Wendy Bowling

- Progress on Goals from the Last Week:
 - The Board for Student Organization Funding (Formally the Student Funding Board) has allocated out 63% of their budget thus far.  - The Assumptions from the University were recently given to us. We are working on evaluating how this effects our budget for future years and creating options of how it can be addressed.
 - I presented to the ASCSU Senate on 1/23/13 about the changes to Summer Student Fees to make them more equitable. A resolution encouraging a ratio of 70% the fall and spring fees be applied to summer students. This will go to the Student Fee Review Board for further review on Monday.
 - President Martel and I have been working on our Semester Accountability Report. We are in the final stages of this report and it should be available soon.
 - I have been working on creating options for the Student Fee Sustainability Taskforce. We will be meeting next week to discuss these options and hopefully have a resolution to take through senate by the end of February.

 - I am continuing to work with members on the ASCSU Fee Sustainability Taskforce on the plan we will be taking to Senate in February. We will be reviewing documents of current student feedback we have received and necessary information needed to evaluate this fee.
 - President Martel and I will be working over break on the ASCSU accountability report to inform students on our current and future financial standings.
 - I am working with SLiCE to figure out financially what the ramifications of the move to the Mac Gym which will begin in January will look like. Please be aware of what this move means to your departments and think about how you will continue your services next year without the use of the ASCSU office.
