- Executive Branch
 - President – Eric Berlinberg
 - Past Week Follow-Up:
 - Board of Governors Meeting-
 - This past Monday through Wednesday was the October Colorado State University System Board of Governors meeting, held at CSU-Pueblo.
 - I'll be completing my Board write up sometime this week, and will send it out to the listserv once it is complete.
 - The next Board of Governors meeting will be held December 6-7 on the Fort Collins campus.
 - Lory Student Center Renovation-
 - This past week, the CSU System Board of Governors unanimously approved the Program Plan and Cash Spending Authority for the Lory Student Center renovations. As you know, the LSC Renovations is a \$65M project (\$60M student fee-funded, \$5M donor-funded), to begin Summer 2013, and ending Fall 2014.
 - This vote of approval allows the Lory Student Center Master Plan Committee to dive deeper into the planning process for the renovations. Prior to this vote, the Master Plan Committee was not certain the project would move forward. Now that the project is moving forward, the following timeline exists for remaining project approval:
 - October 2011 – Program Plan and Cash Spending Authority approval by Board of Governors
 - December 2011 – Finance Plan approval by Board of Governors
 - February 2011 – Bond Issuance approval by Board of Governors
 - National Coalition of Student Regents and Trustees Conference-
 - This past weekend, Director Eckerdt and I attended the annual National Coalition of Student Regents and Trustees conference in Houston, TX. We learned a lot about different systems of institution board of directors, and how students are involved in their shared governance models. ASCSU has had a strong presence at this conference for the past two years, most recently by President Anderson and Director Strauch in Spring of 2011.
 - Sustainability/Health Split-
 - Thank you to the Senate for approving the Sustainability Coordinator and Health Coordinator job descriptions. Audrey Purdue, ASCSU Sustainability/Health Coordinator, will be up for ratification as the new Health Coordinator this week.
 - There was a lot of debate about the ASCSU budget, questions about changes to the budget from the previously approved version, etc. This Bill was a great reminder for all members of the Legislative that the ASCSU budget is a fluid document. It changes on a nearly daily basis as programs begin to take form, expenses are being incurred, and new initiatives form. I would charge the Senate to remember that current students in Fiscal Year 12 have already paid fees, and we can't refund them. It is our duty as student leaders to effectively, responsibly, and efficiently spend their money on programs and services that directly benefit their experience at Colorado State, increasing the value of their education and time

on campus. We legally can not simply 'hold' money in our accounts and not spend it after a fee has been assessed to students.

- Both Director Strauch and I are more than happy to walk anyone through the ASCSU budget, how it has changed since the end of Spring semester, the Controller books, the current forecast project we are working on, etc.

- I got in contact with my liaison at Resources for Disabled Students.

- Past Week Follow-Up:
 - Physical Development Committee:
 - Lory Student Center, Academic Village, and Animal Science Building projects were submitted to the Board of Governors.
 - Renovations to Academic Village North will add an additional 600 beds, and they are also looking to move forward with Durrell Revitalization starting in August of 2013 which will be a 57 million dollar project upon approval from the BOG.
 - Animal Science is using \$7.5 million in donor funds to renovate the building.
 - Blue Dot Sustainable Housing: On campus house used for sustainable practices. It will be student housing. The students would be conducting research to see the benefits and drawbacks of the sustainable practices that they will be implementing at the house. This is a 600 square foot property.
 - The Mason Corridor: Specifically the bus route that the city will be implementing is called MAX. Construction should be in 2012 and service should be able to start in May 2014. The bus that will be used will be 60 feet long, hold 63 people, run off of natural gas, and have bike racks. The busses will run from 6:00 am to 12:00 pm with ten minute headway and it will take 20 minutes to go from Cherry down to south Harmony. Construction will start to effect campus during the middle of next year and should be around for about 18 months.
 - RamRide task force:
 - Sent out the doodle for the first meeting. At the first meeting we will be discussing the basics of what the purpose of the task force is and look at the possibility of assigning subcommittees. More to come later.
 - SFRB:
 - Finalized liaison assignments and will be going on our first fee area tour on Monday. We will be touring the Career Center, Student Legal, Resources for Adult Learners, and Off-Campus Life.
 - RMSMC (Rocky Mountain Student Media Corporation):
 - Both the Collegian CTV are looking into purchasing new equipment. All student media outlets are looking to up their presence on the web through their website, Facebook, Twitter, etc. So far their numbers are looking better and better.
 - I will be sitting on the financial sub-committee to help review the budget. That meeting is scheduled for 10/18 at 8:00 if anyone would like to attend.
 - SFB:
 - Heard requests from SOGLBT, Up 'till Dawn, and Black Student Alliance. All received full funding for their events.
 - Fort Collins Police Chief Interview Panel:
 - Interviewed four very qualified candidates. All stressed the increased importance of a strong relationship with the university. There is one that the community panel recommended but no candidate has been chosen. The final decision will most likely be in about two or three weeks.
