Academics – Becky Ewing

- Past Week Follow-Up:
 - TestFile: I met with Tim Gallagher, the Chair of the Faculty Council about issues concerning TestFile and he gave me some advice for where to proceed from here. He recommended I talk with the Committee on Teaching and Learning about generating some form of policy to bring to Faculty Council that will help us achieve our goal of expanding TestFile while still respecting the concerns of faculty. We discussed solutions to issues such as integrating it with BlackBoard to protect intellectual property and allowing students to submit tests again but then sending a confirmation to the faculty member before adding it to our test bank.
 - Taking Stock: I met with Kim and she recommended talking with Teri Metzger in Housing and Dining to see if there is any way ASCSU can get involved with the Taking Stock survey or with the U-Turn program. Kim and I are meeting with Teri next week to brainstorm ideas.
 - Committee on Teaching and Learning: I attended the meeting on Monday and the primary topic of discussion was religious accommodation for students. We discussed several ways to try and improve the current policy and are currently in the process of trying to write a new one. I am reaching out to various religious organizations on campus to see if they have any input or examples of when this has been an issues for students in their org.
 - Meeting with Eric and Kaylyn: In this Eric mentioned that there is a desire to make PHIL 173 an option to fulfill an AUCC requirement. I am trying to contact Rabbi Gorelik, who currently teaches the class, to get more information on the class. I also plan to contact the Dean of the Philosophy department to see if they are interested in making this an option.
 - Academic Integrity Week: I sat on the student panel Monday night and it went really well. The students that attended asked some excellent questions and hopefully we were able to fully answer them. I definitely recommend attending this in future years.
 - SFRB retreat: The retreat on Saturday went really well and we were able to hear plans from Mike Ellis about how they want to move the start and finish date up for the LSC renovation by an entire year. It was very interesting to get an update on the renovation and be able to hear how they plan to make the transition as smooth and quick as possible.
