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Executive Branch

- President Regina Martel
 - Progress on Goals from the Last Week:
 - Transfort: John and I met with Kurt about the Transfort service. The price for the Late Night Bus Route will be the same for the coming year. ASCSU will be contributing the same amount.
 - Pending City Council approval of the budget on November 20th we will be making some improvements to the service. With the possible changes happening to the route we will be looking at some new marketing campaigns for the service.
 - We will still be exploring ways that the service can secure long term funding from the DBA or from RAR so less will come from entities like ASCSU and the city.
 - We will be expanding the marketing campaign for the program too, trying to get up-to-date information out about the service. After talking to the Fort Collins Police Department (District 1) we are going to make sure that they are informed about what is going on so they can promote the bus route while they are downtown.
 - Physical Development Committee: There are quite a few construction projects that are getting ready to gear up. BSB: addition of new lecture hall (no building closures are expected) Moby Training Arena –Durrell Center Renovations are on track Animal Science Revitalization Eddy Revitalization. Please see me for specifics on costs and timing of projects.
 - ASCSU Student Fee Sustainability Task Force: has been charged and should start meeting following Fall Break.
 - Fan Behavior Task Force: gathering and assembling our recommendations for Dr. Frank. We will be working with our individual task forces to make sure that the recommendations are clear. Also, we are looking at possibly sending out a student voice survey to see what students, alumni, faculty and staff want to see happen with traditions on campus currently both as a whole university and specifically in athletics. The survey will most likely not be going out before winter break.
 - Late Night Breakfast: we will be partnering with ASAP for the Late Night Breakfast event that
 happens during finals. We will most likely be handing out important stress- relief items and
 possibly some pencils etc.
 - LSC Renovations: the architect team was on campus this week. We are starting to make big decisions regarding the new Senate Chambers, like what we want the speaker area to look like, how to make sure that it has the features of a chamber and does not resemble a classroom, and can be functional for things other than just Senate.
 - Transit and Mobility Group: Again, another project that is in its final design stages and we are looking at some of the specific designs of stops here on campus etc. We are also looking at how MAX can fit in with other transportation initiative that we specifically have and some that the university has specifically a bike sharing program.
 - Greek/ASCSU Meet and Greet: we had the opportunity to have our group meet with leaders in the Greek community and have an open dialogue regarding the relationship between the two groups and ways that we can help each other. We are looking forward to continuing this relationship throughout our administration and hope that it is a lasting relationship.
 - Wendy and I were able to have another successful 'Finances on the Plaza day!'
