- Met with RamRide, opened position until the 9th of November, and talked about the difficulties of a new dispatch system and where we stand when it comes state requirements and budgeting; this discussion is planned to continue with Lance sometime in the next week
- Discussed Super Shuttle vouchers and still working to get them to work better with us in terms of logistics and timeliness
- Attended ZimRide presentation and am very excited if this program is brought to our campus community. Essentially ZimRide is a private social media rideshare program in which is operational nationally and regionally with CU, and UCD. 3 key areas were brought up to begin the conversation revolving on usability (user friendly and built trust with users), building user ship (2-3,000 avg. users w/in the 1st 6 months, and flexibility), and analytics (includes financial savings and CO2 particulate reduction). There are 2 ways to allow for only student or CSU community use, either .edu email logins or EID. The social aspect of the program can either be linked with Facebook or a new standalone profile can be created, it's up to the individual user but at the same time is helpful when looking to share rides. Ways in which the program would be supported on campus will be mainly with a Rideshare Specialist specifically assigned to our campus. That specialist would be responsible for all branding efforts, marketing, getting the word out and helping integrate different options for transportation into the system. The website itself has a lot of cool features targeting for our community and provided from our network. Those include things such as the "Top 5 Departure/Destination Locations," personal profiles, a point system in which we can attach incentives or promos, individual transportation calendars, safety (through means of never giving exact home addresses rather a main cross street near), the ability to charge \$ per seat and show available seats, the ability to exchange money through ZimRide's Transaction Portal partnered with PayPal and the ability to receive sms/push notifications. Lastly we talked about cost which include \$2,500 set up fee (waived if we partner before December 31st), approx. \$830/month (after a discount of \$2000 yearly due to our current partnership with ZipCar), and integration costs of an additional \$4-5,000/year (if we integrate Transfort, MAX, and other alternative transportation services). This program has been added to the universities Climate Action Plan and has a lot of support from many departments across campus including Parking Services, Facilities, Motorpool, Residence & Dining Services and many more which helps when it comes to stakeholders in the program. This program will help support our Climate Action Plan, reduce carbon emissions and help to achieve "net zero" emission, as well as help decrease the congestion of vehicles on campus and freeing up parking as our University continues to grow.
