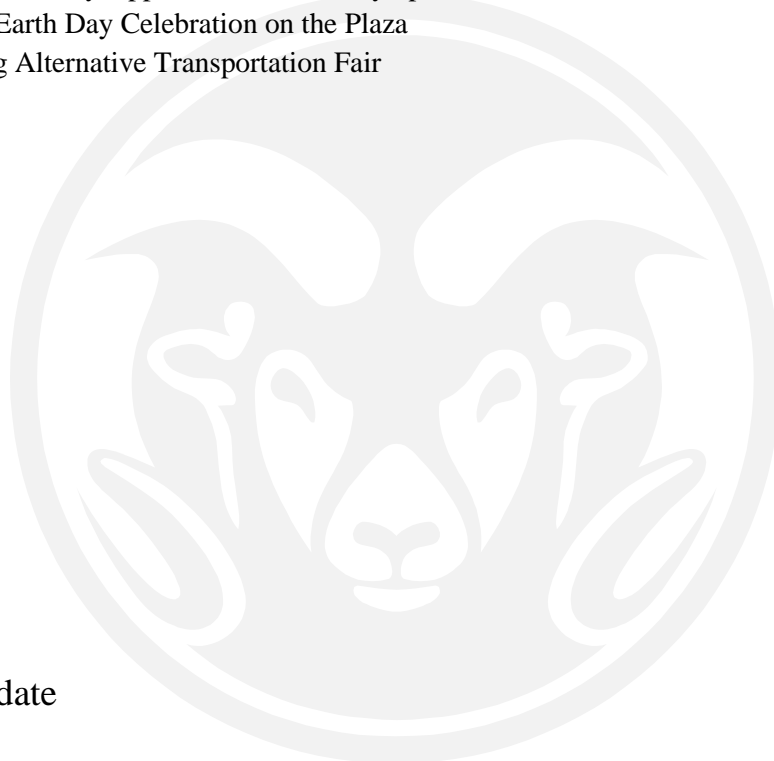

## Executive Branch

- **President – Regina Martel**
  - Progress on Goals from the Last Week:
    - RamRide Advisory Meeting:
      - The group met for an update on the program. The majority of the discussion was around long term visioning for the program. We are looking at the infrastructure of the program, do we have enough staff, do we have enough volunteers, and is our training up to par? This led us to the discussion around volunteerism and starting a culture of volunteering for RamRide being something that truly helps the community and helps our peers.
      - We will be setting up regular reviews with RamRide and city leadership as well as campus police and city police as well as regular trainings for the RamRide staff on emergency procedures etc.
      - We are also starting a legal external review of the program. We are looking at all of the documents, waivers and agreements that volunteers sign.
      - If anyone has any questions about anything going on with RamRide please come and talk to myself, Rob, or Chelsey.
    - Board of Governors:
      - Each of the campuses shared their vision for CSU 2020. At the system level we are looking to improve student satisfaction, expanding state wide presence, expanding the system presence of high education, and creating financial stability.
      - CSU Fort Collins Campus – CSU 2020 model was presented. The biggest threat to higher education is the public defunding of higher education in Colorado. To combat that CSU will be looking at bringing 8,000 new students to Colorado State University. We will manage the resources we have and still work to ensure the excellence and access that we have come to expect from CSU as a Land Grant university. If you have any questions about CSU 2020 or about the Board of Governors meeting I would be happy to answer them.
    - HB – 1151 – The legislation that ASCSU wrote was brought up in committee on Thursday. There was not a vote on the bill as the committee ran out of time, we are looking at possible amendments to the bill and trying to ensure that it can work for other institutions.
    - Lory Student Center Renovations: Senate Chambers were demolished this week! The renovations are moving and shakin!

    - The Student Fee Sustainability Taskforce has reviewed its 5 options and has come up with a recommendation for changes to the ASCSU Student Fee. We will be going forward to the ASCSU Senate with a resolution next Wednesday 2/20/13.     - We are in the process of making sure all of our bills are paid and our finance office is organized as electronically as possible while remaining secure. We are looking at what the effects of being housed in the Mac Gym will mean for our office.
    - The Assumptions from the University were recently given to us. We are working on evaluating how this affects our budget for future years and creating options of how it can be addressed.
    - President Martel and I have been working on our Semester Accountability Report. We are in the final stages of this report and it should be available soon.

The main focus of the week was the **Tax Break for Textbook bill**.

    - Regina and I met with Dr. Mike Ellis and Dr. Tony Frank to discuss CSU's position on the bill.
      - They had a couple logistical concerns, but supported the idea.
      - We discussed a potential amendment, which would expand the bill to include two four day weekends and all off-campus bookstores.
      - Of course, the concern would be that this would inflate the fiscal note, effectively making the likelihood that the bill will pass more minimal.
    - I also met with Jenn and lobbied many of the Members on the House Finance Committee. Most were receptive to the bill, though the larger than expected fiscal note concerned many of them.
    - I also testified in the Finance Committee, in favor of the bill. The bill was not voted on, however, due to time restraints. It will receive a committee vote in the upcoming days.

An additional task that my department has been focusing on is **Advocacy Day**.

    - I've touched base with Nick a number of times to check on the advertising. It looks great!

- Additionally, I have been working with my assistants and deputies to advertise the event in class across the university.
- We have planned and pre-ordered all food, and my deputies and I are trying to align as many guest speakers as possible.

Finally, I focused on drafting a **Student Voice Survey**.

- This was commissioned by the Tuition Task Force.
- This survey will gauge how students respond to the various elements of the University's 2.1 budget, as well as provide information to the task force on student opinion on current tuition rates and how competitive the university is.
