- Progress on Goals from the Last Week:

- I attended the University Budget meetings throughout the day on Wednesday and was able to hear all of the proposals for University Funding. If you have questions about these meetings, what was discussed, or version 2.1 of the Budget please feel free to contact me.
- The Assumptions from the University were recently given to us. We are working on evaluating how this affects our budget for future years and creating options of how it can be addressed.
- The Student Fee Review Board voted to adopt the Summer Student Fee Changes across the University. This will make the ratio of Summer fees 70% of their fall and spring counterparts. For some fee areas this will result in a fall and spring increase, but other fees areas will result in a fall and spring decrease. The overall change is a small decrease to fall and spring students and an increase to summer students. If you have questions about this change please feel free to contact me or any member of the Student Fee Review Board.
- President Martel and I have been working on our Semester Accountability Report. We are in the final stages of this report and it should be available soon.

Goals for the Next Week:

- I will be presenting legislation to Senate for a BSOF Request over \$10,000 as well as presenting the ASCSU Semester Finance Report.
- I am continuing to work with members on the ASCSU Fee Sustainability Taskforce on the plan we will be taking to Senate in February. We will be reviewing documents of current student feedback we have received and necessary information needed to evaluate this fee.

 - Attended the ASCSU Student Fee Task Force and discussed 3 plans of recommendations that could potentially be presented to SFRB in the coming months for the ASCSU plan. Started the talk revolving On Campus, Off Campus and Part-time student fees.
 - Retreat was a success and Hugo did a great job for just joining as Director
 - Met with Governmental Affairs and discussed the Textbook Bill which is sponsored by Dominick Moreno in the House and John Kefalas in Senate. It has been assigned to be sent to both the appropriations and finance committees which could potentially make for a hard pass through, but we have many Universities partnering as well as Community Colleges. We also discussed Advocacy Day and the possibility of renaming the event as it now serves as an educational experience rather advocating. The goal is to get 100 students to attend on March 5th and to partner with Pueblo and Colorado Springs Universities.
 - Met with the group planning the Kelly Kennedy lecture set for March 7th. We are shooting for a 4pm event and a possible VIP event prior and working on acquiring partnerships to host a successful event in the North Ballroom.
 - Met with Grad Affairs and she is working to start a graduate project as well as looking for an assistant.
 - Met with RamRide and discussed parking issues due to construction interferences and plans to present survey results to parking services rather soon. They will also be traveling to Athens, GA for SRPU this weekend to collaborate with other safe ride programs around the nation. Plans are in place to revamp and redesign the RamRide website to make it user friendly and visually appeasing. A 70's or 80's themed weekend has been planned for February 7-9th for RamRide volunteers. A new promotion is also being started with RamRide punch cards; the more times you volunteer the more swag and prizes you can earn including things such as hoodies, sunglasses, shirts and even formal recognition at the RamRide Appreciation Gala at the end of the semester.
 - Scheduled the RamRide Advisory Board meeting to be on the 12th of February at 12:30pm to touch base and talk about the GA job description, funding, infrastructure, protocols/policies, and RamRide in general.

Governmental Affairs – Lindon Belshe

- Progress on Goals from the Last Week:
 - A great deal of work and several alterations have gone into the **Textbook Tax Break bill**.
 - It was introduced just a little over a week ago. The bill now has committee assignments, though it has not been slated in committee as of yet. The first it will be going to is the House Committee on Finance. From there it will go on to Appropriations and on to the Senate.
 - Since finding out that it was assigned to these committees, I have spent a great deal of time discussing strategy with our lobbyist, Jenn Penn. We have not seen a fiscal note, which should be released before the bill is docketed in its first committee. The cost to the state will be critical in determining the strategy that we choose.
 - Randy Fischer was added as a co-sponsor to the bill, and I have been approaching several legislators to discuss the content. Many are supportive, and we are hoping to add a number of names to the co-sponsors list.
 - I also spent a bit of time working to research other state's policies on textbook tax breaks. While we have a list of 17 states, including their enacting legislation and specific policies, there are apparently 4 states that we overlooked.
 - I was also approached with a concern with the bill. A couple individuals were concerned that the tax break, being limited to one day, might concentrate an increase in traffic to that specific day beyond what the bookstore can handle (without bringing in additional registers). While we had inquired about this concern over the past summer (and the consensus amongst bookstore directors was that it would not be an issue), I corresponded with Rick Hershman, the Vice President of Government Relations for the National Association of College Stores. He felt otherwise, pointing to a state that had explored a similar approach. He also agreed that we need to limit the fiscal note, as to elicit the best response from the General Assembly (and, thus, increase the likelihood that the bill will pass). We all agree that we hope to see the bill expanded to include a period as long as possible!
 - Finally, I have begun drafting a *Collegian* guest column article about the bill.
 - My department has officially begun planning Advocacy Day, as well.
 - It will take place on March 5th, beginning at 7:30A and ending around 3:30P.
 - We will be serving Einstein's bagels for breakfast and Jimmy John's subs for lunch.



- We'll be hearing from several key legislators about the future and importance of higher
 education. We will also be leading groups of students around to speak with legislators in
 small groups, a practice that has been the highlight of many participants in the past years.
- My deputies have been drafting invitations for the event, and my assistants have been compiling a list of classes that we can advertise Advocacy Day in.
- I also met with our Marketing Director, Nick, to discuss all other advertising approaches.
- I also **met with Rep. Singer** about speaking at Senate (ASCSU) next week.
 - He'll be addressing his bills and the importance of investing in higher education. He has been an advocate for students since being appointed to a vacant seat last year.
 - He is also a former ASCSU Senator and will be speaking about how important ASCSU is to having a strong future in the job market and the political arena.
- The largest project that my department has been focusing on in the past week has been addressing the purposed 9% increase to **tuition**.
 - President Martel commissioned the Tuition Task Force, and we had our first meeting last Tuesday (January 22).
 - Throughout this 2 hour session, we discussed a number of issues surrounding the cost of education, financial aid and projected cost increases.
 - We explored the benefits and costs of salary increases, and we looked at tuition increases over the past decade.
 - The Task Force explored specific numbers, accounting for alterations in enrollment and increases (at 5%) to operations costs.
 - We also looked closely at the standing revenue proposals coming out of the Joint Budget Committee.
 - The Procedure
 - I began preparing for the meeting by drafting a letter that explained the current state of the university and the state and preparing an agenda.
 - Director of Finance Wendy Bowling also researched and prepared a spreadsheet noting a number of expenditures and sources of revenue that the university was considering or obligated to pay/receive. We worked off of these documents, as well as all university published financial documents.
 - We then took proposals from those in attendance. The six submitted included proposing lower salary increases and reducing tuition; lower tuition with no mention of salaries; salary increases only for graduate students; suggesting alternative funding sources; and having no salary increases, while reducing tuition to as low of a rate as possible.
 - We conducted one round of voting, eliminating the three most unpopular options.
 - We then conducted a second round of voting.
 - The second voting round determined the strong stance that students were in favor of freezing salaries, as to ensure as little tuition increases as possible.



- This vote commissioned the Chair (myself) to draft a Senate Resolution supporting the above position. I did so. The bill was then discussed, placed on emergency status and passed 14-2 the following night (after a great deal of discussion). There was an amendment proposed, which would have made it so the bill noted that the students supported tuition increases only to balance the budget, but it failed. It didn't fail due to a lack of support but because the policy is already in place (as law), and the language didn't work well with the bill.
- I have begun planning the next Tuition Task Force meeting, which will revisit the issue with new numbers. It will also direct the forwarding of the previously passed Senate resolution.
- Another focus this week was New World Politics.
 - We have rights to the site for the next 6 months, and we are currently in the process of drafting a contract for the site.
 - We are boosting it up with content and have been working towards ensuring a successful launch day.
 - That includes working with Nick to plan a launch party and an advertising campaign.
- Our department is also brainstorming a couple of ideas for this semester, which I will be addressing next week.
- Finally, we have begun **tracking legislation** and formulating a position and response procedure on the state level.
- Goals for the Next Week:
 - Meet with all the Members of the House Finance committee to discuss the tax holiday bill.
 - Hand-deliver (with Deputy Director Smith) all invitations to Advocacy Day.
 - Finalize all planning for this semester with my department.
 - Hold our next Tuition Task Force meeting.
