 - This event was almost entirely handled by the Congressman's office, but Matt, Regina and I did meet and discuss tuition and concealed carry afterwards.
 - We also finished assembling **Day at the Capitol**.
 - This entailed confirming transportation, ordering food, requesting supplies, finalizing our list of speakers (thank-you, Matt), and confirming that we have a conference room booked.
 - \circ The room only seats forty, but we will be able to bring in additional seating as needed. REMEMBER, IT IS MARCH 5TH (TUESDAY).
 - Another focus of our department was the **ASCSU Senate resolution**, which addressed **concealed carry**.
 - This issue was quite contentious, and we conducted two days of polling on the plaza to assess the student position.
 - Finding that 79% of the students that wished to share an opinion were in support of concealed carry, I introduced the resolution to read that students oppose H.B. 13-1226, which would ban concealed-carry on all university campuses.
 - This was a very contentious bill, but it passed by a strong majority.
 - We also worked on **New World Politics** quite a bit.
 - The department's assistants have updated the website, and I have been drafting NWP's final contract draft.
 - I've also been working with marketing to develop material to hand out on the plaza for its launch party.
 - We have also been planning and preparing for the upcoming **Tuition Task Force Meeting.**
 - I invited Dr. Rick Miranda to share and present the university budget at our next meeting.



- I've also worked with Director Dotson to release and compose a student voice survey on tuition rates. This was sent out this week, and the results will be announced to the Task Force next Thursday.
