- VI. Guest Speaker
 - Shields and Elizabeth underpass. The technical term for this project is grade separation. Some benefits of this project will be safety, increased comfort, improved function, and a gateway opportunity. The City of Fort Collins and CSU have been working on this project in a joint effort. This conversation has been in the works for the past 15 years and have been looking for a way to improve the infrastructure west of campus. The West Elizabeth corridor project is about to go to the city council. This has been in the planning stage for some time now. Spring 2016, a feasibility study was addressed to find solutions to some major issues. One of those issues was the floodplain. We looked at both an overpass and underpass to determine the benefits of either option. This extensive study included several different crossing points that included several different factors like the amount of car and pedestrian traffic as well as the costs. The reoccurring themes that we have heard have been is keeping through traffic, minimizing cut-through traffic, enhance safety, support bike and pedestrians, and keeping everyone safe. The heaviest bike, pedestrian, and transit corridor in Fort Collins. More than 2000 bikes cross Shields per day. We were also able to gather some crash data. These were only reported values and are likely higher. For the future, we are continuing to grow. We will also have more traffic on game day with the new stadium. The Shields street will be taking the grunt of the traffic from these events. With the current design, there will be the underpass but also the current

crossing methods. The lanes and parking will be adjusted. This is all pending at the moment. Should the agreements come to surface, we would be able to start construction on December 1, 2016 and would be completed by the opening of the stadium. It would occur in a three phase system to complete the project. We are working on reviewing the documents to create a more finalized version of the plan. We have an entire webpage dedicated to this project with more information and details to the project. It also includes a feedback portion for people to fill out.

Questions

- i. Senator Pyfrom: How will the use of the pass be with the current path still there.
 - 1. That is hard to predict but allows for the delay to be less than the current system.
- ii. Senator Ruiz: Why would you want to move the sidewalk to the east, wouldn't that be more hazardous?
 - 1. People and owners were afraid of hazardous situations closer to the intersections.
- iii. Senate Officer Horowitz: Would the underpass be flooded?
 - The tunnel will be built to a flood standard and will be designed to keep water out. There will be a high point built to keep water out.
- iv. Senator Auer: Are there any other methods in place? How do you intend to further the infrastructure for game days with lighting?
 - 1. There won't be any vegetation methods just to the nature of the pavement in the area.
 - 2. The design is for more than just game day use. The trail itself and the tunnel will be lit and will be on 24 hours every day. There will be cameras in the tunnel and along the pathway that will be in the CSU current system. Safe Walk will also include this into their program.
- v. Senator Ashe: What is the funding?
 - The project itself is 8.5 million dollars and will have a budget of 10 million dollars. The funding will come from the administration and will not be related to tuition based costs. It will be similar to other IGA projects.

- vi. Senator Hansen: If approved by City Council, when will it be ready? What is the outreach for student input?
 - 1. It will be completed by the first game in the new stadium.
 - 2. The project has been presented to multiple groups on campus and to different groups. That is the challenge. I did mention the feedback portion on the webpage.

 - 1. We do ask the contracting group to consider that. We do expect some involvement.

 - Yes, potentially. It also takes into consideration game day management for those events. Game days are highly managed with police on the ground.
