ABSTRACT: This bill seeks to create two professional positions under the supervision of the Legislative Cabinet whose main task will be increasing access for students. In particular, online students by creating audiovisual material about the Associated Students of Colorado State University (ASCSU) and documentation of Senate Sessions.

WHEREAS

ENDORSED BY:

ASCSU has a fiscal obligation to all students through fees or other revenue from which the ASCSU budget is created and said budget is to be utilized for their benefit; and,

WHEREAS

During FY17 ASCSU will, as part of an agreement with CSU Online, begin receiving revenue from online students in the amount of \$41,755 for services provided by ASCSU for the benefit of CSU Online students which will increase to \$83,510 in FY18 once the agreement reaches maturity; and,

WHEREAS

Online students paying into the ASCSU budget should receive benefit from this money that positively impacts their experience at CSU and their access to ASCSU resources and initiatives; and,

WHEREAS

ASCSU has a fiduciary responsibility to make its business and objectives, especially that business dealing with the expenditure of CSU Online student money, open to the review and input of CSU Online students; and,

WHEREAS

CSU Online students will most easily be able to access their student government, ASCSU, and its materials through its online presence; and,

WHEREAS

Audiovisual materials housed on the ASCSU website and social media accounts will help effectively communicate the intent and business of the organization to CSU Online students and may, with additional technical capabilities, yield live online input for important meetings and events; and,

WHEREAS

The creation of two Videography Specialist positions would additionally benefit non-CSU Online students by creating a more accessible ASCSU with clear objectives and accessible business; and,

WHEREAS

The attached itemized budget for the entire program, to include stipends and appropriate equipment, was compiled to maximize system interoperability with existing CSU equipment, increase total suite longevity, and create comparable in-house talent.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY BE ENACTED

That the Forty-Sixth Senate approves the attached job description of the Videography Specialist; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER BE ENACTED

That these Videography Specialists be accountable to the Legislative Cabinet through the Speaker Pro Tempore of the Senate; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER BE ENACTED

That the money to stipend two videography specialists according to the amount listed in the job description, be pulled from the Senate General Discretionary wherever it may reside and be allocated to the Senate earmark of the ASCSU Payroll, account 23-61400; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER BE ENACTED

That a total of \$6,470 be allocated into the Senate account, account 23-61500, under a new earmark heading to be titled "*Videography Expenses*" in accordance with the proposed FY17 Senate Videography budget as attached; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER BE ENACTED

That the AV specialist provide accessibility such as, closed captioning, ASL English interpreting, etc in their works; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER BE ENACTED

That a Technical and a Stakeholder committee be formed to investigate implementation.
