Traveling in the Pedestrian lanes increases the risk of accidents for both Longboarders and Pedestrians; and,

WHEREAS

Having Longboards in pedestrian lanes creates unacceptable risks for persons with wheelchairs, crutches, or similar issues with mobility; and,

WHEREAS

Whereas communication with CSU administration does not clarify the statues of longboarders and creates a "grey area" in terms of the rights and responsibility of longboarders; so,

That the ASCSU senate urges CSU administration to allow Longboarders to ride in the bike lanes instead of the pedestrian lanes; and,

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED

That CSU administration further look into how to reduce conflicts between Longboarders Bikers and Pedestrians; and,

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED

That CSU administration better communicate with incoming students the rights and responsibilities of Longboarders on the CSU campus; and,
