ABSTRACT: Amending the LSAB bylaws to include a disciplinary removal process conducted by the internal complaint function of the ASCSU Supreme Court.

WHEREAS

The Legislative Strategy Advisory Board is brand new and will require edits; and,

WHEREAS

This is a procedure that is well meditated and fundamentally required; so,

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED

That the following Section be added to Article III Membership of the Legislative Strategy Advisory Board Bylaws;

Section 3: Disciplinary Removal Process

If any one member is speculated to violate these bylaws, the ASCSU Constitution, or the ASCSU Code of Ethics, any member of ASCSU shall submit an internal complaint to determine whether or not the member stands in violation of the goals of ASCSU or the bylaws of the LSAB board. Should Judiciary substantiate the claims, that member shall be suspended from LSAB for a minimum of the time it takes the court to rule and a maximum of two weeks. Should Judiciary determine, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the court, that members(s) of the board have violated these bylaws, the ASCSU Constitution, or Code of Ethics, the judicial branch has the power to pursue disciplinary

measures. A two-thirds (2/3) majority of Supreme Court may dismiss various member(s) for one academic year of the board via a Supreme Court ruling. (Co-)Chair(s) of the board of LSAB may not be dismissed and an ex officio Judicial member must sit on LSAB. If an issue with the (Co-)Chair(s) arises, an internal complaint should be submitted to the ASCSU Judicial Branch, and will be dealt with accordingly- whether that be through ASCSU suspension or another disciplinary measure deemed by the Court by their own processes.
