EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This week, I began organizing a public planning commission for the CSU Campus

Thrift Store. This marks a turning point in my work in ASCSU, and the undertaking of a larger project that I hope to positively impact our community for time to come.

I am reconsidering the pocket pantry model for our school. The advantages of having disbursed and anonymous accessibility to emergency food sources are significant, but I'm beginning to think that a single, full sized and operable pantry would provide more resources to students. The ability to staff a student on site to assist in food distribution, donation acceptance, maintenance, and other tasks would offer an opportunity to create more robust infrastructure. A refrigerator would pose no issue if it was regularly checked, and a larger space could provide options for increased nutritional variety. We could even locate some basic cooking infrastructure on the spot for students that need to eat! The main argument for pocket pantries is accessibility and anonymity. However, 4 of our 6 pantries are either behind locked doors or in areas

restricted to specific students, staff, and faculty. Anonymity is key, but only because food insecurity and poverty on our university campuses is stigmatized. An increased awareness of accessible food resources, and the sheer amount of people facing food insecurity on campus would help to dismantle this stigma. If poverty is a stigma in a domain which charges tens of thousands per year for membership, it would be better to alleviate the issue effectively at the expense of the domain's image, not its denizens. Finally, it would be very simple to continue operating the main pocket pantry in front of ASCSU, stocking it with emergency foods for 24/7 access. This is just speculation, but I will be doing more research moving forward, to provide CSU students with the best possible option for food insecurity alleviation.
