Currently, the plan is for all four of the designs created by CSU Creative Services to be featured on our ballot for students to decide. We will also be looking at our own purchasing of the shirts to see if we need to cut back on the number of shirts we order for our own purposes.

We have begun working with the LSC to rearrange the vestibule outside of our office to expand the food area.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We have also begun talks with SLiCE to potentially transition the re-stocking of these pantries to their staff, as we do not have flexible enough schedules to consistently restock these ourselves.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Election Preparation 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ASCSU Supreme Court • Office of the President • Department of Marketing • ASCSU’s General Election happens the three weeks following spring break, this year starting March 25th and ending April 10th. • We have nearly finished the hiring process and will hopefully have the job description and candidate through the Senate in the next two weeks. • We have already begun creating the marketing materials and will start circulating material to recruit people to run.
