• Test/Notes Bank	<ul> <li>Department of Academics</li> <li>Office of the President</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>We are working to reinvent the existing ASCSU Test Bank to bring it online and update it with recent tests.</li> <li>It has become clear that a significant portion of the faculty are opposed to any movement of tests online, or indeed students being able to access them before the exam day at all.</li> <li>We have begun investigating having a "notes" bank instead, allowing students to access notes from previous students in the course.</li> <li>Need to schedule a meeting with Rick Miranda or Kelly Long to get approval ASAP.</li> </ul>

Newton Statue     "Giants" Project	Department of Traditions and Programs	<ul> <li>We have been looking into a project that would add statues to the area at the intersection of Pitkin and Central.</li> <li>The idea is to have a set of statues of famous "firsts" from CSU's history, tying into the quote from Isaac Newton on the current monument: "If I have seen further it is by standing on the shoulders of Giants."</li> <li>We have been talking to the Physical Development Committee and other university stakeholders on how to proceed on this.</li> </ul>
