 Preparation for Next Year 	ASCSU Executive Branch	 We are preparing for the transition to next year's administration, which will start on June 1st.

		 The Executive Branch has started writing our transition reports as well as making our suggested edits to the job descriptions. We have almost finished compiling our budgets and financial documentation together for the next year. We have started this earlier than last year to try and give the new incoming President and Vice President an easier job.
