EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This week, I've been working extensively to allocate resources and plan the facilitation of the upcoming Student Health Fair. The event is less than a month away, and I have chosen to expand the role of ASCSU Health to accommodate an event which better reflects the principles and ethos of this year's administration. I found that focusing my attention on this event yielded a very quick execution of my tasks, and I was able to fulfill nearly everything required of me in the first week of my month-long initiative. I'm looking forward to using this event to provide education, resources, events that encompass a holistic, intersectional, and accessible health perspective.

This week also marks the beginning of what I hope to be a new chapter in redefining the significance of food insecurity on campus. With the help of SLiCE coordinator Nevan Mandel, we have finally obtained the formal results of CSU's first statistically valid survey of student food and housing insecurities. The data from this survey affirms the suspicions of many invested in the food insecurity network on campus; that we are facing a crisis of access to consistent, nutritional food supply impacting mental health, academic performance, and social wellbeing amongst the student body. The good news is that these findings are a catalyst for renewed innovation and focus to address the problems we face. As the week comes to a close, various parties involved in addressing food insecurity on campus are preparing to meet, collectively imagine, and execute the next vision of CSU food insecurity

infrastructure. New developments will come shortly, and in the meantime, I'm excited to continue working on the variety of other tasks contained within the health department of cabinet.
