THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ENACTED


That the Supreme Court Liaison position be created as an un-paid position in the judicial branch of ASCSU using the attached job description.

ASCSU SUPREME COURT SUPREME COURT LIAISON JOB DESCRIPTION

The ASCSU Supreme Court Supreme Court Liaison will be nominated by the ASCSU President and approved by majority vote of the ASCSU Senate. The Supreme Court Liaison will serve a one-year term beginning on the day of their approval until the same day one year later. The Supreme Court Liaison is eligible for reappointment subject to the approval of the ASCSU President. Upon vacancy of the Supreme Court Liaison position, an applicant will be nominated by the ASCSU President and approved by a majority vote of the ASCSU Senate.

Applicants must be full-time members of ASCSU at the time of nomination and shall have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0. If appointed, a Supreme Court Liaison must remain enrolled throughout the regular academic year (spring and fall semester) within the term of office.

Background:

1. Have some experiences working in groups and present a desire to polish that skill.
2. Have a reasonable ability to conduct a logical debate and present a clear argument.

Responsibilities:

1. Serve as liaison between the Supreme Court and ASCSU Departments, the general Student Body, and other members of the CSU campus community, including the Office of Conflict Resolution and Student Conduct Services, the Office of Greek Life, Sport Clubs, Student Organizations, and Student Legal Services.
2. Advocate for and assist, in conjunction with Student Legal Services, students filing appeals and going through the university discipline process.
3. Attend judicial meetings and other functions scheduled by the court.
4. Keep a minimum of one office hour per week.
5. Serve on the Back on TRAC Program board if requested.
6. Attend a minimum of three ASCSU sponsored events including, but not limited to:
 - a. RamRide
 - b. Ram Leadership
 - c. Cabinet level activities
