**ABSTRACT: This bill seeks to provide funding of \$8,000 from the Senate Discretionary Fund for the purpose of hosting two optional First Aid and CPR/AED trainings for Colorado State University students.**

**WHEREAS**

The Mission of ASCSU reads, "...the primary objective of the ASCSU is to serve students wherever possible."; and,

**WHEREAS**

Providing optional First Aid and CPR/AED trainings would enable CSU students to learn how to save lives and respond in emergency situations; and,

**WHEREAS**

These trainings would empower participants to be better assets to their communities and the student body as they would possess life-saving skills they can use whenever called upon to do so; and,

**WHEREAS**

The American Red Cross offers certification in First Aid and CPR/AED. This training lasts five hours and covers preventing, identifying, and responding to medical emergencies. Successful completion of a training session assures a 2-year certification in First Aid and CPR/AED; and,

**WHEREAS**

This level of training costs an onsite delivery fee of \$250 and an additional expected fee of \$120 per participant; so,

**THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED**

That the Fifty-Second Senate of the Associated Students of Colorado State University allocate \$6,500 from the Senate Discretionary Fund to the American Red Cross for the purpose of funding two First Aid and CPR/AED training sessions in the Spring 2023 semester; and,

**THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED**

That these trainings be open to all Colorado State University Students on a first come first serve basis with a limit of 25 attendees per training for a total target number of fifty attendees; and,

**THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED**

That there shall be a cap of 10 ASCSU officials per session filling the 25 seats until up to 10 days before the scheduled training. If more than 15 non-ASCSU officials sign up for the training before the 10 ASCSU officials do,

**THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED**

That the Fifty-Second Senate of the Associated Students of Colorado State University allocate \$1,500 from the Senate Discretionary Fund to pay for excess costs involved with hosting these events; including, but not limited to, renting rooms for the events; and,

**THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED**

That any funds not spent under the passage of this bill by May 31, 2023, be returned to the Senate Discretionary Fund; and,

**THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED**

That a copy of this bill be forwarded to Rick Miranda, CSU President; Rob Long, ASCSU President; Jessica Sholts, ASCSU Advisor; Jessica Dyr Dahl, ASCSU Advisor; Tony Frank, CSU Chancellor; and Ashton Duffield, ASCSU Accountant.
