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**ABSTRACT:** This bill aims to provide \$2,345 of funding to the Real Estate Club for operational and marketing expenses necessary for club sustainability and growth.

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**WHEREAS**

The CSU Real Estate Club provides members with speakers of reputable backgrounds from top of the line residential brokers to high end commercial real estate investment managers and developers. With the funds being used to sustain the club, our members will continue to grow by networking with these industry professionals, bettering themselves for their future careers.

**WHEREAS**

The CSU Real Estate Club will use the funds to finish financing food, essential for optimal attendance, and providing members/ real estate department faculty with professional club apparel

in the form of quarter zip pullovers. This apparel will be professional in appearance and used as a marketing tool for the club, bringing more attention to the Real Estate Club.

**WHEREAS**

The CSU Real Estate Club will use the marketing tool to bring more students to meetings and further educate members and attendees interested in real estate. This will go beyond the classroom lectures, and expand on the current practices of the industry. In turn, this will result in more prepared graduates from CSU, ready to improve and make their mark in the real estate realm.

**WHEREAS**

The CSU Real Estate Club attracts bright and intelligent students, and by improving our reach as a club to attract more members, we can provide a larger group of students ready to elevate the real estate market. The CSU Real Estate Club receives no funding from the College of Business, so, the CSU Real Estate Club requests \$2,345 for operational expenses for its 35 weekly members (less than \$60 per student); so,
