ABSTRACT: Outlining ASCSU's official opposition to the City of Fort Collins' policy targeting cool fall nights with friends and family hanging out around a campfire.

WHEREAS

The City of Fort Collins has dictated a 10:00pm curfew and a 25-foot setback for all campfires within the City; and,

WHEREAS

Most property's do not have 25 feet between their house and the house out their backyard, thus effectively eliminating campfires; and,

WHEREAS

Campfires are a staple of a Coloradan's way of life and outdoor lifestyle; and,

WHEREAS

Campfires with friends and family are a staple of a CSU Student's weekend and nights off; and,

WHEREAS

Colorado is the gateway to the Rocky Mountains in every form; and,

WHEREAS

Fall weather is accompanied by the enjoyment of gathering around a campfire with close friends and family, talking late into the night and building strong personal bonds; and,

WHEREAS

Campfires are the dominant and proper source of the preparation of S'mores; so,

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED

That the Senate and the students of Colorado State University encourage the City Council of Fort Collins to reverse this discriminatory policy; and,

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED

That Senate and the students of Colorado State University encourage people to have fun and run their campfires to a time that pleases them; and,

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED

A student's campfire, on a student's property, is a student's property; and,

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED

That ASCSU encourages the City to, at the very least, push the curfew back to midnight, if not outright abolished; and,

THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED
