ABSTRACT: *This bill aims to fund sexual health kits to be assembled and distributed to students before university absences through the Women and Social Justice Caucus.*

WHEREAS (1),

Many students lose access to crucial resources on campus when they leave for breaks, especially out of state students; and,

WHEREAS (2),

Sexual health items can be inaccessible for many students, especially out of state students, due to cost or access. Legislation in many states bans or restricts access to reproductive healthcare such as abortion and makes access to items such as plan B or birth control prohibitively expensive or difficult to acquire; and,

WHEREAS (3),

In a survey conducted on various CSU students, around 50% exhibited a need for such sexual health kits over university absences; and,

WHEREAS (4),

Additionally, using precedent from Bill 5417 in the 54th session and the aforementioned survey, these kits will contain condoms, pregnancy test strips, emergency contraceptive (“Plan B”), candy canes, and general resources for students; and,

WHEREAS (5),

These kits will contain items listed below, with the cost breakdown included,

WHEREAS (6),

Students who receive these kits are saving around \$30 dollars on average (for condoms, plan b, and a pregnancy test) in addition to having access to sexual health items they may not have otherwise; **so,**

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED (1)

That \$1,750 from the Senate Discretionary Fund be transferred to the Women’s and Social Justice Caucus to fund the purchase and assembly of sexual health kits; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED (2)

That ASCSU help market and support the Women’s and Social Justice Caucus’s Sexual Health Kit Assembly Volunteer Days, with these volunteer days expected to occur the week of December first; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED (3)

That any unspent funds be returned to the Senate Discretionary Fund on January 1st, 2026; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ENACTED (5)
